# Bottle-table

Crochet pattern

**Material:**

- crochet hook size 2.5
- Wool: Mouzakis Butterfly Super 10
- Water-bottle or Coca-Cola bottle
- Margarine box or similar plastic material, I have used an plastic folder
- Spray paint (acrylic paint)
- glue or/and hot glue
- sewing needle, scissor
- beads, braids, buttons ...

**Size:** The table has a height of about 5 cm (1,97 inches)

**Abbreviations:**

ch - chain

R - round

sc – single crochet

dc – double crochet

Number x sc – the number tells you how many times you make a single crochet  
(or a dc, hdc ...) in each stitch

inc - make two single crochet in one stitch

dec - crochet two stitches together with a sc

rep - repeat until end of round

sl st - slip stitch

**BLO** – back loops only

**Note:**

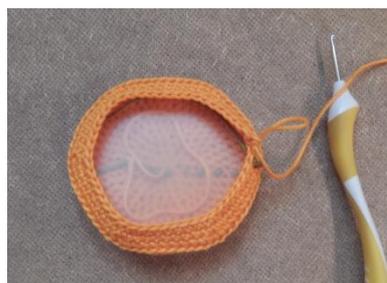
Unless indicated otherwise, the parts are worked in rounds. You can start with 2 ch or make a magic ring. The rows should be marked with a thread.



First, you need the tabletop. You can use a cup or a glass of water to draw a circle on your plastic material and then cut it out. My table has a diameter of 3,35 inches.

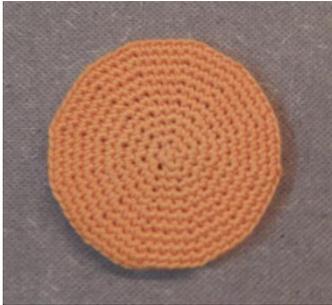


Then crochet around the tabletop

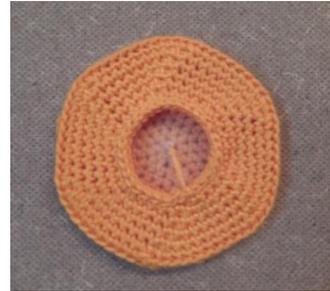


And when the tabletop is finished, it looks like this:

**Top side**



**Bottom side**



**You can easily adjust the instruction for the tabletop to the desired size:**

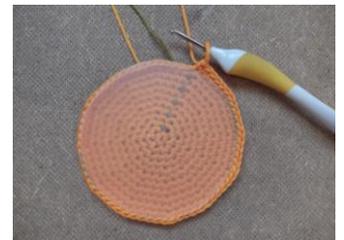
1. Crochet the rounds until you have reached the edge of your table top
2. Then crochet one round without increasing stitches and use only the back loops
3. Make another round with the same number of stitches
4. Start in the next round with decreasing and use only the back loops

### Tabletop

2 x ch

R 01	6 x sc in second ch from hook	6
R 02	inc in each stitch	12
R 03	sc, inc, rep	18
R 04	2 x sc, inc, rep	24
R 05	sc, inc, (3 x sc, inc) x 5, 2 x sc	30
R 06	4 x sc, inc, rep	36
R 07	2 x sc, inc, (5 x sc, inc) x 5, 3 x sc	42
R 08	6 x sc, inc, rep	48
R 09	3 x sc, inc, (7 x sc, inc) x 5, 4 x sc	54
R 10	8 x sc, inc, rep	60
R 11	4 x sc, (9 x sc, inc) x 5, 5 x sc	66

Now you have reached the edge of the tabletop. From here you crochet sc in each stitch but only in the back loops. If your table top is larger, then you can crochet more rounds with increasing the stitches.



R 12	<b>BLO:</b> sc in each stitch	66
R 13	sc in each stitch	66
R 14	<b>BLO:</b> 9 x sc, dec, rep	60
R 15	8 x sc, dec, rep	54

R 16 7 x sc, dec, rep, **insert the plastic tabletop after this round** **48**



R 17 6 x sc, dec, rep **42**

R 18 5 x sc, dec, rep **36**

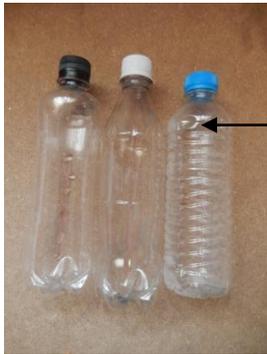
R 19 4 x sc, dec, rep **30**

R 20 sl st in each stitch **30**

Cut the thread and sew it

## Table base

For the table base we need a plastic bottle. I have tested different bottles and I think the best bottle is the 1-liter Coca-Cola bottle, because they have a long and thin bottleneck.



 Cut the bottleneck at the desired height.

I have cut them at a height of about 1,97 inches.



Then spray the table base with spray paint (acrylic paint) and let the color dry.



If you want, you can crochet around the table base:

45 x ch and close it with a sl st to a ring.

*Please check the size to see how many ch you need for your table base*

45 x sc 45

45 x dc 45

3 x sc, dec, rep until end of round,

sl st, cut the thread and sew it

Pull this ring over the table base and glue it.

## Finishing

Now you can decorate the tabletop with beads, braids and fringes. Then glue the table top to the table base and your bottle-table is finished.
